



**Annette Morgan, Director
of the Curtin Tax Clinic in
Australia**

Annette Morgan is a distinguished leader in taxation, experiential learning, and industry–community engagement, recognised for her significant contributions across academia, professional practice, and public service. She is a Senior Lecturer and Course/Major Coordinator for Taxation at Curtin University, and the Academic Lead of the Industry and Community Hub within the Faculty of

Business and Law.

In her role as Academic Lead of the Hub, Annette provides strategic and operational leadership across all Work-Integrated Learning (WIL), Practice-Based Learning (PBL), clinics, internships, study tours, and industry-engaged projects within the Faculty. She oversees the design, governance, quality assurance, and scaling of experiential learning models, working closely with academic staff, professional teams, industry partners, community organisations, and offshore campuses to ensure initiatives are pedagogically sound, sustainable, and aligned with Faculty and University strategy. This role has positioned her as a key architect of Curtin’s contemporary engagement and employability agenda.

Annette is also the Co-Founder and long-standing Director of the Curtin Tax Clinic, Australia’s first pro bono university-based tax clinic, which has become a nationally recognised model under the National Tax Clinic Program. Through this work, she has led significant growth in student-led community services, secured substantial external funding, and expanded outreach to vulnerable and under-served communities, embedding authentic clinical education into the taxation curriculum.

Her professional influence extends nationally through advisory and stewardship roles with the Australian Taxation Office, the Tax Practitioners Board, the Taxation Institute of Australia, and government and professional committees. Annette is also actively engaged in scholarship and dissemination, regularly presenting at national conferences and authoring academic and professional publications in taxation, financial literacy, and clinical education.

Annette’s leadership has been recognised through multiple awards, including national and institutional honours, reflecting the impact of her work in advancing equitable access to

services, transforming experiential learning, and strengthening the connection between universities, industry, and the community.
